
Steve Chrisman



Steve Chrisman of Seal Rock, OR, began working as Pendleton's Economic Development Director on September 5. He will focus on creating family wage jobs, helping existing businesses expand, getting industrial sites up to state building standards, and marketing. A chief concern for Chrisman is attracting businesses to the industrial park near Airport Road.

Chrisman moved from Sea Girt, NJ to Oregon in 1990 to attend Southern Oregon University. He graduated in 1994 with a bachelor's in business administration with an emphasis in marketing. He is married to Shannon Chrisman, and they have two daughters, Cheney and Ella. His family will stay in Seal Rock for about a year before they move to Pendleton.

Robb Corbett was hired by the City of Pendleton in December 2011 after serving as Manager in Sutherlin, Prineville, and Burns. NEW RESEARCH STUDY

The Eleanor Roosevelt Fund provides the money for AAUW's wonderful research studies. A new study will be released on November 15 - which is National Philanthropy Day. The new study is titled "Graduating to a Pay Gap" and covers the high cost of a college education. It examines the debt that students incur and how it is especially hard for women, who still earn 77ϕ to the \$1 men earn.


