AAUW PENDLETON BRANCH MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

Thursday, May 3, 2012 Vert Clubroom

We gathered at the Vert with host Hero Gollany who made her wonderful baklava. There were 13 members and 2 guests.

President Jill Heffner called the meeting to order at 7:20 p.m. She asked that our guests be introduced and then asked that we all introduce ourselves and tell one good thing about rain.

At this point our speaker arrived and the meeting was suspended.

Michele Sitz, Co-Program Vice President, introduced our speaker, Dr. Rosemary Powers who teaches at Eastern Oregon University. Her field is Sociology with an emphasis on Feminism and questions of power and privilege. She spoke of the unknown and un-named elephant in the room, which is the Crisis in Care. Who is available to take care of the children and the elderly if corporate America doesn't see the need for a change in their thinking on daycare and the responsibilities of parents. It was a great speech, and she graciously answered our questions afterwards.

The meeting resumed at 8:00 p.m.

- 1. There were no minutes since our last meeting was a work party.
- 2. Finance report presented by Gail Plute, Finance VP. The balances as of 5/1/12 were: checking, \$660.27, and savings, \$6,296.60. Scholarship money will be paid to BMCC before the first of July. It will be a \$1,000 scholarship this year. Jill reminded the members that we had voted to spend about \$600 to reimburse Board members for their registration fee for the Convention.
- 3. Jill alerted us to the need for a two minute activist response. The Violence Against Women Act was passed by the U.S. Senate but has stalled in the House of Representatives. Each of us should contact our representative and urge the passage of this Act.

Jill also reported that she had been in touch with Margaret Gianotti who is with the BMCC Foundation. They have not had to use our Amy Bedford funds for GED tests because CAPECO has been paying for them. Melissa moved and Gail seconded that we make that \$50 available to cover the cost of either a student success class or a college readiness class for those women who have passed their GED. Motion was approved.

4. Susan Badger Doyle reported that the delegates to the Convention had voted to increase the State dues by \$5.00, so that will be added to our dues being collected for the coming year.

The Lunch Bunch will meet on May 17 at 11:15 a.m. at Heritage Station to carpool to Weston to the Long Branch Saloon.

5. Election of Officers: The slate was presented as follows:

Co-Presidents, Karen King and Marty King
Co-Program Vice Presidents Mary Kinsch and Jill Heffner

Communications Vice President Lisa-Marie Patterson Membership Vice President Susan Badger Doyle

They were all elected by acclamation.

6. Convention Report, Susan: we had 106 registered attendees. It was very successful and the evaluations were uniformly positive. The Silent Auction was particularly praised for its set-up and organization. Thank you Marty and Karen! The auction made approximately \$3,800.00, which will go to

the AAUW Funds. Jill also asked that we have a motion to send \$150.00 more dollars to the AAUW Funds, which was the amount that people generously donated to cover the cost of the movie that was shown on Friday night. We actually made an estimated \$1,000.00 for our Branch with the Convention, so Jill feels guilty that she asked for more from the audience. It was moved, seconded, and approved.

7. Marlene Krout spoke about our interest in Title IX and how Pendleton Schools do in compliance. We will make a full study in the Fall with the start of the school year.

The next Board meeting is May 17 at 7:00 p.m. at Marty King's house.

The next General Meeting is on Saturday, June 9, and will be a picnic potluck in Pioneer Park, after which Keith May will lead us on a walking tour of North Hill.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

Mary Lee Bates



Longtime branch member Mary Lee Bates, born August 28, 1926, passed away peacefully surrounded by her family on May 22, 2012. Mary was born in Ordway, Colorado, the third of eight children. She married Mel Bates in August 1947. Mary received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from Linfield College, and Masters in Library Science from the University of Washington.

Mary enjoyed music throughout her life, and she and Mel traveled extensively, visiting all U.S. states, many Canadian provinces, and seven European countries. Mary taught at the elementary through graduate level. She was the founding librarian at Blue Mountain Community College and served as the Director of

Library Services. She was active in many organizations. She served as president of several library associations, the Pendleton Women's Club, and was our AAUW branch president 1970–72. She was selected as First Citizen of Pendleton in 1971.

Mary is survived by her husband Mel, two sons, two daughters, nine grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren. She was an important member of our community, and her always cheerful presence at branch activities will be missed.
