This condensed version will be reviewed at the April 7th General Membership meeting.

Planning for several April projects began in March: continued support of BMCC's Student Affiliate group; Equal Pay Day; and AAUW Oregon State Convention planning. We will be distributing Pay Day candy bars on the BMCC campus April 12th assisted by our Student Affiliates emphasizing that women work 15 1/2 months to earn the wage men make in 12 months—or .79é for every \$1.00 men are paid. Any member available is encouraged to assist with the Equal Pay Project (likely between 10:00 am to 2:00 pm on April 12th) and should call Karen King for details. It will be a treat to have as many of our members as possible to meet and work with the BMCC women students.

Jill Heffner and I will be your voting delegates at the State Convention in Medford, April 22–24. At the April 7th General Membership meeting, Melissa will review the Oregon State By-Law policies being addressed to obtain your opinion so Jill and I may represent your vote.

One other activity in which we are encouraged to participate by the state AAUW is the Women's Foundation of Oregon's "Listen to Her Town Hall" scheduled for April 27th, 5:30–7:00 pm at BMCC with child care and snacks provided. The Women's Foundation is gathering information to complete a comprehensive report on the status of women and girls in Oregon, which is to be used by legislative committees and leaders at the state, county, and municipality levels to address the needs of this population.

Mother Daughter Choices

Pendleton Branch began offering Mother Daughter Choices in 1990 to fifth, sixth, or seventh grade girls and their mothers (or sponsors). The Mother Daughter Choices Program is designed to prepare girls for the kinds of decisions they will be making as they move into young adulthood. The program teaches valuable life skills such as goal setting, problem solving, decision making, and assertive responsible behavior. The six-week program provides an approach to encourage parental influence, self-reflection, and a focus on educational needs, career expectations, and personal planning. Small groups of mothers and daughters meet weekly in a relaxed environment to discuss issues of mutual concern.


After several years in which the Mother Daughter Choices program was not offered, two Pendleton Branch members, Mary Davis and Kate Ely, rejuvenated the program and offered it again beginning in February, 2016. They are in the process of updating the materials as they work through them with a new group of daughters and their mothers. They would like to add a similar program, known as Father Son Challenges, for boys and their fathers.
