AAUW PENDLETON BRANCH GENERAL MEETING, MAY 7, 2015

We met at the Vert with thirteen members, five guests, and the two guest speakers present. Hosts were Susan Doyle and Melissa Woodbury. SSG Eric Smidt and CW2 Vanessa Stedman from the Oregon Army National Guard presented "Drone Technology and the UAV Site in Pendleton." Following the presentation and question and answer session, Michelle Monkman made a short presentation in support of the Pendleton School District bond measure, and Casey White-Zollman made a presentation in support of the Blue Mountain Community College bond measure.

Co-President Melissa Woodbury called the business meeting to order at 8:25 p.m.

Dianne Barnes sent the financial report: There is \$1,494 in checking and \$7,240 in savings for a total cash on hand of \$8,734. Members were reminded to pay their annual dues.


Meeting adjourned at 8:33 p.m.

A New Book By Member Mary Johnson Available Now

A Caregiver's Guide: Insights into the Later Years, Mary A. Johnson, PhD



Mary A. Johnsson has not only studied aging, but has managed assisted living communities, as well as experienced the caregiving role for family members. Her academic background and professional experience coupled with her personal experience in caregiving make this book valuable for both professional caregivers and family members providing care for a loved one. Caregiving can be stressful, and often is; however, with the information in this book, caregiving can be more enjoyable for both caregiver and patient.

Chapters describe the many losses a patient may have experienced, and how the losses may affect the attitude and behavior of the patient. Suggestions for providing care -- physical, mental, and emotional -- are plentiful, with activities that can be fun for both the caregiver and the patient. There are also chapters on dementia, including Alzheimer's

disease; coping with the stress of caregiving; caring for a patient during the dying process; and an extensive reading list of other sources of information that may be helpful.
