VOTE:

Thanks to our speakers at October's general meeting. Dr. Cam Preuss and Susan Plass presented information about the BMCC Measure No: 30–96, a 15-year proposal for facilities at a cost of \$0.31 per \$1,000. Debbie McBee and Jon Peterson then spoke about the Pendleton School District, 16R Measure No: 30-95. This will be at a tax rate of \$2.30 per \$1,000 bond, not to exceed 25 years, and is also for facilities. Both are continuations of current taxes.

GENERAL MEETING October 10, 2013

Twenty members and six guests gathered at the Vert with hosts Mary Johnson and Gwen Fjeld.

At 7:20 p.m., Jill Heffner, Program Co-Vice President, introduced our speaker, Dr. Camille Preus, President of Blue Mountain Community College. She spoke on the need to pass the continuing bond that will be on the ballot on Nov. 5. The bond, which this one will replace, was passed in 1999 and this will be an unchanged tax amount of \$.31 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation on our property tax. She showed an eight minute video on how they plan to use the \$25 million that the bond will raise.

At 8:10 p.m. our second speakers were introduced, John Peterson and Deb McBee, who spoke on the upcoming bond issue for the Pendleton Schools. This is also a continuation bond with no additional cost to taxpayers. That bond is for \$2.30 per \$1,000 of assessed value. An outside consultant found that the district could use \$100 million to do everything that is needed, but this bond will raise \$50–55 million. Washington and Sherwood Elementary Schools will be torn down and rebuilt. Lincoln School will become the district offices. West Hills will be the Alternative High School, and Hawthorne School will have both Head Start and the all-day kindergartens. There will be three schools for grades 1–5.

Business Meeting:

- 1. Jill said that she needed hosts for the April General Meeting. There were no volunteers.
- 2. The minutes of the June meeting were approved as published in the Newsletter.
- 3. Finance report presented by Dianne Barnes, Finance VP. She presented a very complete explanation for the budget for 2013–14 and answered questions. The budget was passed by the membership.
- 4. The phone tree sign-up sheet was passed around for those who want to be called before each meeting.
- 5. BMCC Scholarships Margaret Gianotti found two women to each receive a scholarship this year. One of them decided to go to another school, so we have just one recipient this year, Dusty Wadkins. The Board voted to have only one this year and one each of the next two years.
- 6. Pioneer Park Marty King reported that 10 people worked 150 hours over three days to get all the rest of the pickets painted and placed, as well as a new section of fence and park sign built. There were over 1,000 pickets sold and installed in the playground; this includes the original pickets that survived the fire. The donor board is in progress. The two elements that were held up in Customs have been installed. The City of Pendleton has applied for the rest of the insurance money but has not heard back yet (maximum of about \$28,000). Once the final project budget gets set, they will write grants for adding the rubberized pathway and benches. The pathway will make the playground more accessible than just the fiber chips. The map of the picket locations has been updated and given to the Parks Department. The new sign should be installed in November.
- 7. Grapefruit Kathy Ward said everyone should have her list. The price is the same this year, \$17.50 for a box and \$9.00 for half a box. Pick-up will be on Dec. 7 at PGG.

The next Lunch Bunch is Thursday, Oct. 17. We will meet at the Heritage Station parking lot to carpool to Boardman to the Riverview Restaurant.

The next Board meeting is Oct. 17 at 7:00 p.m. at Melissa Woodbury's house.

The next General Meeting is Thursday, Nov. 14, at the East Oregonian building at 7:00 p.m.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

Pioneer Park Update


