Walla Wala Plastics Recycling

Numbers 1 and 2 Plastics can be recycled in Walla Walla at the Walla Walla Recycling Center, at 827 N. 12st Street.

Directions:

Go straight through Walla Walla, on 9th to Pine Street, turn left. Turn right on N 13th, go under the highway 12 overpass, turn right on the next street (Elm Street). Immediate right turn into the Walla Walla Recycling Center. The bin for plastics is a small green bin. It takes Number 1 and 2 in the triangle ONLY, that is 1 PET and 2 HDPET.

Equal Pay Day

This year, Equal Pay Day was April 2, 2019. Equal Pay Day is the extra time that it takes women, on average, to work to make the same amount as white men did in 2018. Actually, Equal Pay Day varies by race and ethnicity. For Asian women, Equal Pay Day is March 5, 2019; for white, non-Hispanic women, it is April 19; for black or African-American women, it is August 22; for Native Indian women, it is September 23; and for Hispanic and Latina women, it is November 20. Think about that!! It takes Hispanic and Latina women almost one full year to catch up to white men in wages.

Pendleton Branch had a table at Great Pacific from 10:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. Karen King was joined by branch members to hand out Pay Day candy bars and information.

ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP DUES

It's once again time to pay annual membership dues for 2019/2020, which are due by June 30. Dues this year are \$59 for National AAUW, \$16 for State AAUW, and \$9 for Branch AAUW, for a total of \$84.

But Wait!! There are some changes this year. Our Branch has joined the Membership Payment Program (MPP). This will allow you more options in how you pay your dues. You will still be able to pay dues with a check (made out to AAUW) given to Joan Deroko (Membership VP) or Karen King (Finance VP & Dues Treasurer). A membership form is attached for your convenience. King will deposit your check, go to the National website, verify your info, and approve withdrawal of funds from our account to pay the National and State dues.

Alternately, **you will be able to pay on-line using your credit card**. The easiest way to do this is to send me an E-mail (kaking71@charter.net) requesting the link, and I will send you an invoice with a link to the national website. When you click on the link, it will go directly to your AAUW membership listing where you can verify and update your information. Then you will be asked to enter your credit card information. You will need to pay the full \$84 at that time. AAUW National will deposit the state and branch fees directly to us.

Another option is to go to AAUW National (www.aauw.org); login using your membership number (center of your Directory under your name) and password; choose Renew Membership; verify and update your information; and then enter your credit card information.

This is a big change, so stay tuned for updates, and we appreciate your patience as we work out the details of this new system.
