Our January Program Speaker Carollyn Robinson R.N., B.S.N.

My Name is Carollyn Robinson and I'm the RN Clinical Liaison and Volunteer Coordinator for Vange John Memorial Hospice a department of Good Shepherd Health Care Systems. My role involves talking with people about what hospice services are and about End of Life. My other role is coordinating our volunteer force to provide additional support to our hospice families and support to the hospice team in the office.

I am passionate about connecting with people who are facing life limiting illness to help them understand what resources and support are available to them.

My work in the field of hospice has varied over the last 30 years from bedside nursing to managing the hospice team to meeting people where they are and discussing what their goals of care may be at End of Life.

On a personal level, knowing what it was like not to have the service of hospice for a loved one available, to then years later having the service for another loved one who was in need of hospice service, helps me to relate to those I am talking with
