The program not only kept track of total boxes going out but also sent the data to individual seller sheets, enabling us to print a list to each seller upon request. The Valley Giving Guide provides support for nonprofit organizations within Walla Walla, Columbia, Garfield, and Umatilla Counties. The Blue Mountain Community Foundation and the United Way of the Blue Mountains collaborated to bring about this endeavor.

The Valley Giving Guide is a unique opportunity to create a collective impact on the causes that matter in our local community. Each gift is boosted with funds from the Bonus Pool, with the greatest boost for gifts made online. Your full donation will flow through to the causes you choose. Sponsorship dollars cover all fees or you can opt to pay them; therefore, increasing the Bonus Pool to create more funds for the organizations you most care about.

Donations are accepted until December 31, 2024.

On the main page you may search for a specific organization and the community and cause automatically come up. You may also leave the search blank but add the community you are interested in and organizations for that community then come up. The search is refined if you add a cause.

Examples of organizations participating from Umatilla County include, for example, Blue Mountain Wildlife, Eastern Oregon Climate Change Coalition, and Pendleton Center for the Arts.
